- While a USB device is connected to the instrument, you should wait for six seconds or more between these operations: (1) when turning the power of the instrument off then on again, or (2) when alternately connecting/disconnecting the USB cable.

Studio Manager

Studio Manager is a cross-platform application that enables you to start multiple Editors that control YAMAHA hardware products remotely, and to save multiple Editor settings.

You can run Studio Manager as a stand-alone application, or as a plug-in within DAW (digital audio workstation)/ sequencer applications that are compatible with Total Recall, such as Cubase SX 3.0.1 or later. 

Troubleshooting

When controlling the hardware from a computer via USB/Ethernet/mLAN, the hardware does not operate correctly or no sound is heard.

- Is the USB/mLAN cable connected correctly? Owner's manual for your particular hardware
- Is the Ethernet cable connected correctly? Connect the computer to the hardware by using an Ethernet cable via a hub. When connecting the computer to the hardware directly, use a crossover cable.

- If your computer has automatically activated any power-saving mode (such as suspended, sleep, standby) when using the USB connection, the computer may "freeze," or the driver may stop working. When using USB, disable any power-saving mode on the computer.

Playback response is delayed.
